Shannon will walk you through his UK teaching experience

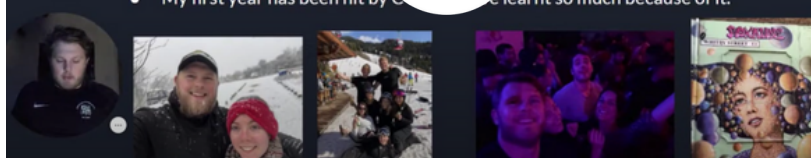
